Licking	Granville Township Trustees	Raccoon Valley Park Bridge & Trail	\$1,094,146.00	\$150,000.00	This proposal is for a pedestrian pathway and bridge, which would connect the TJ Evans Trail to the Raccoon Valley Park Sports Complex. The proposed bridge improvements will consist of the construction of a 277 foot long pedestrian, truss-style bridge, which will have a width of 14 feet total. The proposed pathway improvements will have a total width of 10 feet with 2 foot shoulders on each side. The entire project length totals 926 linear feet.
Erie	Huron	Fabens Park Trail	\$245,565.00	\$150,000.00	To construct a multipurpose loop trail around Fabens Park in Huron Ohio. The path will be 1-mile by 10 foot wide to accommodate pedestrians and non-motorized traffic.
Wayne	Wayne County Park District	Casey's Trail	\$375,272.70	\$150,000.00	Installation two accessible parking lots and 1.31 miles of trail at Barnes Preserve. The overall goal of this project is to construct trail, which will offer different opportunities to individuals with disabilities.
Cuyahoga	West Creek Preservation Committee	West Creek Greenway-Phase 2	\$100,000.00	\$75,000.00	Acquiring 16.5 acres of real property along the West Creek Greenway Trail system. The parcel of land will also connect to Shiloh Middle School and dense residential neighborhood.
Ashtabula	Ashtabula County MetroParks	Western Reserve Greenway Trail-Equip	\$50,000.00	\$34,695.00	This grant proposal requests funding for the purchase of a Boomford model Kestrel S boom mower. This mower will replace a 1964 John Deere with 2500 hours, on it and a side mounted mower, which has become a maintenance problem and rarely works anymore.
Greene	Five Rivers Metro Parks	Beginner's Loop and Skills Areas	\$221,072.00	\$144,329.00	This proposed project includes 1.5 miles of beginner's mountain biking trail, mountain biking skills development areas, bike wash area, trailhead parking improvements and a vault toilet that will support recreation by families, youth and beginners at Five Rivers Metro Parks Huffman MetroPark.

Butler	ODNR, Division of Parks and Recreation	Little Miami Scenic River Trail	\$300,000.00	\$150,000.00	Maintenance work along the Little Miami Scenic River Trail consisting of repairing asphalt, damaged culverts, and sinkholes.
Lake	Willoughby	Osborne Park Multi-use Path	\$112,169.00	\$40,756.00	This project consists of a 1-mile by 8 foot wide asphalt multi-use trail in Osborn Park that will provide pedestrian access to Lake Erie, surrounding neighborhoods and to the bike path on Lakeshore Boulevard.
Hocking/Perry	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest	2013 Dorr Run/US33 Bypass Project	\$204,000.00	\$170,000.00	Reconnecting the southern portion of the 12 mile Dorr Run Loop that was cut off and closed due to construction of the US highway 33 Bypass. This section of highway affecting Dorr Run Trail has been completed, but new trail is needed to navigate around and under the new highway. A large culvert was placed under the highway to allow for a new trail connection to be made on the west side of the loop, and infrastructure has been put in place to allow for a new trail connection under Company Road on the east side of the loop.
Various	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest	Education Grant	\$12,430.00	\$10,000.00	RTP funds will be used to purchase educational supplies (i.e. brochures that contain safety and responsible land use messages) that would be given to trail riders through our Trail Permit and Trail Patrol Programs.
Lawrence	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest	Ironton District ATV Trails Systems	\$187,500.00	\$150,000.00	This proposed project will maintain approximately 25 to 59 miles of ATV trails on the Ironton Ranger District of the Wayne National Forest. This work will include the removal of hazard trees, light tread work on approximately 70 percent of trail, heavy tread work on 30 percent of trail brushing of trail sides, cleaning drainage dips, improve drainage of water off trail surface.
Pike, Perry, Jackson, Fulton	ODNR, Division of Forestry	State Forest APV Areas	\$125,000.00	\$100,000.00	This grant proposal is for trail maintenance that includes grading, trail improvement, sign repair and trailhead maintenance/improvement at Pike, Perry, Richland Furnace and Maumee State Forest APV Areas.
Hocking & Perry	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest, Athens	Monday Creek OHV Trail System	\$739,400.00	\$367,321.44	Proposal includes improvements to trailheads (entryways and parking areas), replacement of 11 trail bridges and one causeway, construction of an additional 3/4 miles of trail, which will complete the new Loop Trail in Green Township of Hocking County, and the replacement of one toilet.
